Derby Economic Development Project update report

May 2024

ACTIVE PROJECTS

Main Street/Route 34 widening project report:

Over the past two weeks for the Reconstruction of Route 34 (Main Street) in Derby includes the following items:

- Installing granite curb and sidewalk (Stage 6) Minerva to Caroline
- Installing electrical conduit and cable (Stage 6) Minerva to Caroline
- Installing trees in Stage 6 areas.
- Installing drainage on Water Street (Stage 8)
- Demo of sidewalk Roosevelt Drive (Stage 8)
- Installing granite curb and sidewalk (Stage 8) Roosevelt Dr., Third St., Olivia St.

Current estimate of project completion date is October 2024.

Division Street and Seymour Ave. Safety Improvements

- The NVCOG approved the project at the April 3, 2024 meeting.
- Luchs Consulting Engineers have submitted the full LOTCIP application (\$3M) to NVCOG for them to submit to CTDOT for approval.

City-wide Pavement Program

- Luchs investigated the possibility of using the remaining funds to pave Silver Hill Road.
- Luchs assisted in the Fountain Lake development effort and the planning for this year's paving program.

Rehabilitation of Derby Greenway Pedestrian Bridge

- ATANE, the designer confirmed to the city that their design will be completed around mid-May.
- At that time Luchs will review their design and advise the city of the findings.

Main Street South site use redevelopment

 Barretta Enterprises are seeking City help to find a new location for their landscaping business in Derby.

 Status of Relocation & remediation of Rubino's metal recycling business remains in executive session of BoAA. Interested Developers continue to check in for progress updates.

Trolley Pointe Development (90 Main Street)

- Exterior construction largely complete, 105 apartments, 27 will be offered as workforce housing, subsidized by CT Dept. of Housing - mix one- and two-bedroom units.
- Early tenants include CT International Trade Center
- Occupancy expected December 2024.

Cedar Village (67-71 Minerva Street) redevelopment

 Exterior construction mostly completed of 95 apartments with 10% Affordable Housing. Occupancy expected in October 2024.
 Cedar Village & Brennan Developers developing preliminary plans for condo housing project on Summit Hill in Derby which will minimize removal of rock. Discussed with P&Z

Derby Parking Garage - stabilization and restoration

• The City of Derby requested \$10,000,000 of CDS funds to hire a state qualified vendor to complete essential safety repairs and restoration to its 49-year-old 4-floor 300-space municipal public parking garage, located on Thompson Place (between Elizabeth Street and Olivia Street). The scope of this project involves partial and full-depth concrete repairs, roof construction, structural steel repairs, waterproofing, painting, plumbing/drainage enhancements, stairs improvements, elevator safety updates, adding EV stations, engineering, and contingency.

Expansion of Derby Landfill (1.5MW-4.0 MW) ground based Solar System

- There remain some sentiments among concerned citizens that the existing solar installation on the Derby landfill by Green Energy is not generating significant benefits to the City.
- The Derby CT 0.55MW PV facility located on the municipal landfill was installed by Green Energy in 2015, so is approaching 10 years in situ and efficiency and cost/benefits of PVs have improved substantially in that time perio



- BQEnergy has since acquired the assets of the original installer and has made a case for expanding the capacity up to 4MW..
- UI is also seeking new sources of renewable energy as you will be aware.
- Frankly, we would understand if BQEnergy had made enough unappreciated presentations to the Derby Board of Alders to discourage further conversation, but from an economic development perspective, we still have an underperforming City owned land parcel of some 40 acres.
- We have asked BQEnergy if were to reopen conversation, what commercial arrangement would make most sense for both parties, maybe not the land lease that we explored previously

EXPLORATORY PROJECTS:

CT Main Street Center (CMSC) conducted Downtown Derby Program
assessment, draft report and recommendations presented for a
collaborative project. CIF-5 \$150,000 grant application is being actively
explored with CMSC for submission A community meeting with CMSC has
been scheduled for 24 May.

Other active developments include:

- XLI, a Rochester NY based Contract manufacturer, met with the City and we are exploring, with other parties, a potential design & build of a 50,000 SF manufacturing facility that would create around 150 new high skill jobs in Derby.
- We have had further discussions with Architects and Lawyers representing the Block Family Trust and reviewed their preliminary plans which would include 280 apartments and some 55 single family homes and 14 acres of public open space on their 70 acre land parcel in Derby.
- We received an application for the prevailing City of Derby tax incentive program for \$3.6M, the estimated cost of improvements of 33 Elizabeth Street, a project pre-approved for 32 apartments and first floor retail space, which could provide 40-50 new jobs, management and maintenance staff will provide a further 5-8 permanent jobs. The time frame will take approximately 24-30 months from planned start in August 2024 to finish.

The following is a report on the activities of the Fire Marshal's Office for the Month of April 2024.

OFFICE TIME:

The following hours include the time the staff (Deputy Fire Marshal & Inspector) put in at the office for staff meetings, training, investigations, writing reports, etc. The total for this month is 90 hours. Fire Marshal's time is 35-hour s a week, split between office hours and field work.

PLAN REVIEWS:

The Fire Marshal's office reviewed 7 plan reviews spanning from building renovations, cooking hoods systems, fire alarm systems, and sprinkler systems Cedar Village and Trolley Point continue to submit plans for review as development progress continues.

PROPERTY INSPECTIONS:

There are 12 properties in various stages of the code compliance process. These include commercial and multifamily housing inspections and reinspection. In addition to sprinkler systems, fire alarm testing, and cooking hoods and suppression systems testing.

Fire Investigations:

The month of March saw 1 structure fire that required a fire marshal's presence. This fire was investigated and reported, utilizing approximately 4 hours of labor time.

Summary:

For the Month of April, our office completed all the city's largest retail outlets inspections. Mercantile properties are on a 3-year inspection cycle per state statue. We have inspected all the stand alone or smaller strip plaza mercantile occupancies to complete our state requirements. There are still follow up inspections of these properties to determine if violations have been corrected. Additionally, we have completed a full year cycle of multifamily house inspections. This was a major undertaking by our office. This is the first year we completed all 254 multifamily home inspections in over five years. We are now on track to start from the beginning and schedule appointments for the new inspection cycle. 2023 was an important year for updating our ownership records, along with addresses and contact information that have been eluding us for years. This work will save us many office hours trying to track down responsible parties. We now have phone number contacts where we can call and schedule inspections, instead of the timely process of sending out mailings. This process has already begun. Our deputy marshal and inspector are in the process of calling contacts and scheduling inspections for a month out. This gives the owner time to prepare and allows for advance scheduling notice for this office. The turnaround time has been greatly improved.

Derby Housing Authority (DHA) Imagineers Update on HCV Program November 2023 NOTHING NEW TO REPORT

- New Fair Market Rents (FMRs): HUD published new FMRs for 2024. Effective January 1, 2024 the payment standard will need to be adjusted based on HUD's criteria to set the payment standard within the basic range of 90 to 110% of the FMR. As you may recall last year's payment standards were set at 120% of the FMR via HUD's approved regulatory waiver. The waiver expires 12/31/2023. We continue to believe that setting the payment standard using the highest percentage possible will allow the flexibility necessary to make sure that voucher holders are able to use their vouchers and help with rental assistance and to also ascertain that there is a better utilization rate for Derby's voucher program.
- Section 8 Management Assessment Program (SEMAP): We have not received HUD's SEMAP designation letter as of 10/31/2023. However HUD's Secured System shows that Derby's designation is "High Performer" with earned points of 140 out of a possible 145 points and an overall score of 97%. Before our administration of Derby's HCV program the designation was "Standard Performer".
- Utility Allowance Schedule: We have begun to solicit the utility consumption bills from the program participants in order to do the analysis for next year's utility allowance schedule that will be effective 3/1/24.
- HUD's Requirement for DHA to have an updated 5 Year PHA Agency Plan The 5 Year PHA Agency Plan will need to be drafted for the upcoming five-year term. We recently contacted Zuri for the first steps in preparing for this requirement.

The preparation of the plan included the following steps:

- 1. Draft the 5-year plan which includes identifying goals and objectives in serving the needs of families for the next 5 years and progress report on previous 5-year plan.
- 2. Legal Notice needs to appear in the New Haven Register announcing the public meeting 45 days prior to the hearing date.
- 3. 5-year plan and invite to solicit comments or suggestions needs to be mailed to random current program participants and landlords.
- 4. State certification needs to mail out to the authorized representative at the State to confirm that Derby's 5-Year PHA Plan is consistent with their consolidated plan.

After the public hearing is held, we will record any comments or suggestions received for the 5 Year Plan. The 5-Year Plan will be finalized and will also include the certifications from the State and the Civil Rights Certification signed by the Executive Director and the Board Chairperson; we will then submit these documents to HUD electronically.

- 1 Activation of the McConney Grove group text for a river statements occurred. We are planning to meet with the residents this summer and review flood alert and evacuation action plans.
- Director Neuendorf attended the regional DEMHS monthly meeting.
- A possible grant for EOC upgrades is being reviewed. There is a May 15th submission date to the state for the grant.
- EOC UPS(backup power units) battery prices were obtained (3-year replacement). There are shortages and delays from numerous manufacturers and the older devices may need replacement vs. new batteries.
- Communications assets were deployed to Fairfield to assist with multiple university activities occurring simultaniously over a weekend. 8 portable radios were used and returned in good condition.
- Deputy EMD David Lenart is coordination with the regional DEMHS office after completing instructor training at the National Fire academy in Maryland. The training will allows him to instruct NIMS (National Incident Management System) training for first responders. There is currently a shortage of instructors for these classes and this will be a great asset for the region allowing local classes to be held vs. travel out of the area for training.
- Ongoing work/updates to the local emergency plan continue. A quarterly submission to the DEMHS region with updated contacts is due next month.

Outside book and A/V drops are open 24/7 for people to return their items. There are 3 full-time staff members and a part-time library staff of 9, as well as 2 part-time custodians. The Derby Public Library is a member of the Bibliomation Consortium which connects us to over 68 other libraries in the state of Connecticut.



DRN (Disability Resource Network) consistently includes DPL visits as part of their weekly routine.

The Library Board chose a winner of the annual Derby Public Library Essay Scholarship Contest from among the 7 Derby students who entered from Derby High School, Emmett O'Brien, and Sacred Heart Academy. The \$1000 scholarship was awarded to Dahiana Rodriguez from Derby High School. She will meet with the Library Board members at their May 15 meeting.

The Silver Sluggers returned to their regular meetings at the Library in April. Their June 20th meeting this year, will mark their 500th meeting at the Derby Public Library.

I gave my formal notice of resignation as Library Director to the Mayor and the Library Board and will be leaving the Library for my new position as Library Director of the Milford Public Library in May. While I am indeed sad to be leaving DPL, I know good work was accomplished in my time heading the Derby Public Library, in my efforts to use a modern approach to customer service, promotion, and outreach, provide engaging and informative programming to the community, inspire staff to do their best work, and help to improve the user experience for patrons, as we begin to see burgeoning numbers of people in the community utilizing the services and programs we provide at Derby Public Library.

Board of Alderman Report May 2024 Water Pollution Control Authority

Plant – The plant is operating within permit limits.

Plant Upgrade – In 2014 the City passed a \$31.42 million dollar referendum to replace three of the City's pump stations and begin plant upgrades. As of November 2022, approximately \$15 million dollars have been used on replacing the three pump stations and sewer main replacement in the RT-34 project. With approximately \$16.4 million dollars remaining the focus has turned on a full facilities upgrade (under DEEP order) with a cost estimated at \$60 million dollars.

Collections System – Third quarter sewer cleaning completed.

Pump Station – All four pump stations are operating without issue.

Bid Waiver – The WPCA is requesting a bid waiver for emergency repair costs in excess of \$15,000.
