





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Chief of Staff's Report

September 2025:

Meeting with Jodie Enriquez: she was telling me that she is seeing elderly residents who are unable to stay in their homes due to the cost-of-living expenses. There are even people with no mortgages who are struggling. I sent her the phone number for the Derby Housing Authority. We have 109 units on 3 sites. There is a waiting list but the sooner they apply, the better. She was also looking for speakers who could talk with seniors about reverse mortgages or home equity loans. I gave her the number for David Morgsn, Team's director. He has access to free services for seniors as well as information on food, housing, and heating assistance.

Board of Ct. Municipal Development Authority (CMDA):

Last winter, David Kooris came to meet with the mayor and his team about an innovative program designed to increase housing close to railroad stations. After bringing this program to the BOA/A, we were approved to opt in. I'm happy to report that last week we were notified by David Kooris himself that we were the 2nd city in the state to be established as a Transit Oriented Development District with Naugatuck being the 1st.

This will allow developers who choose to build within a ½ mile of the Derby/ Shelton Railroad Station, the ability to receive some state monies in the form of grants.

Update on Parking Garage:

There was only one bidder for the RFP that was published several months ago. That bidder was Midland, the folks who did Cedar Village at Minerva. Their bid came with the codicil that they be allowed to take a 90-day due diligence period to make sure they could do the project for under \$1,500,000. Within the 90-day period, the bid was withdrawn. They wanted to put 54 apartments, 27 on the existing 4th floor and 27 on the 5th floor they planned to add. They do not believe they can do the project within their budget.

A structural analysis is currently being conducted to ascertain the building's ability to accommodate an additional floor with housing units. A revised RFP will be issued in October - there is now potential for CMDA financial support as a city owned property.

Update on the Scrap Yard:

In 2005-2008, NVCOG did Phase 1, Phase 2 and Phase 3 environmental assessment as well as some remediation on the Commerce Street site Mr. Rubino is interested in buying for his relocation. Because once a site has been designated as having contamination, it cannot be sold without an updated Phase 1 to ensure it's clean. Thanks to a grant from NVCOG, Arcadis did an updated Phase 1. By the owner's admission, after remediation, he had torn down buildings containing asbestos, likely

recontamination of the site. Attorney Buturla is assessing what, if anything, is the proper course to take given this information.

Worker Safety:

In discussions with HR, I've become aware we need a Safety Committee, some trainings for DPW and WPCA around safety issues, assuring they have and use PPE appropriately. Working with Human Resources to begin to put this together.

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Derby Economic Development Project Update Report October 2025

Connecticut's economy grew the fastest among states on the East Coast in the spring of 2025, according to new federal data.

In the second quarter of 2025, Connecticut's real gross domestic product increased 4.6%, on an annual basis, ranking joint-ninth among the states and surpassing the national rate of 3.8%, according to data released Friday by the federal Bureau of Economic Analysis. The state's growth was powered by several sectors, including finance and insurance, manufacturing and information.

ACTIVE PROJECTS

Pedestrian safety Improvement projects

- Public hearing approved \$250,000 for pedestrian safety Improvement projects on Route 34 funded by Connecticut Connectivity Grant (CCGP) approved by CTDOT in 2018. Luchs Consulting Engineers are creating RFP for bid of work approved by DOT. Project will provide crosswalks on Route 34 (across from Gilbert St and Bank St.) and at Sodom Lane.
- Public hearing approved \$3.86 Million Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTCIP) grant on Division Street and Seymour Avenue Pedestrian for safety improvements. Luchs Consulting Engineers are completing design details and will initiate RFP in October

Transit Oriented Development (TOD)

 The Board of CT Municipal Development Authority (CMDA) voted positively on September 25th and so we're the second CT municipality to have a district established to provide housing in a \$90 million Transit Oriented development program (1/2 mile from Derby-Shelton railroad station)

- Our goal, with CMDA support, is to complete some 500 housing units in the Derby TOD Zone with appropriate % of Affordable units.
- 79% of Apartments at Trolley Pointe are occupied with a waiting list for 2 bedroom units. Plaque installed on property recognizing its history. 100% of Cedar Village 90 units are now occupied.

O'Sullivan's Island (OSI) Recreational Area/Derby Greenway

- Board of Alders moved to adopt a resolution to enter into an agreement with Naugatuck Valley Council of Governments to administer the two grants (\$356,000) awarded to City of Derby for remediation assessment of OSI. RFP has been drafted and should be issued in early October — a site walk for interested Environmental Consultants is scheduled for October 16th
- UCONN completed and presented a Municipal Assistance Program (MAP) identifying potential recreational uses of O'Sullivan's Island. U Conn final report is available from Economic Development, has been shared with both DEEP and DECD, identified many recreational opportunities for OSI.

2026 Derby Plan of Conservation and Development (POCD)

 RFP has been posted for the update of the 2016 Derby POCD. City of Derby 2026-2036 POCD is scheduled for adoption in May 2026. Derby Economic Development attended and has been appointed to the Steering Committee of the Regional POCD and to the Strategic Advisory Board of the NVC-EDD (formerly known as CEDS)

Derby Parking Garage - Sale and Repurposing.

 After a period of due diligence, the bid that was received has been withdrawn for the renovation and repurpose of the city parking garage. A structural analysis is being modelled to ascertain its robustness to accommodate additional floors with housing units and roof top solar. A revised RFP will be issued in October - there is now potential for CMDA financial support as a City owned property.

Expansion of Derby Landfill (1.5MW-4.0 MW) Ground-Based Solar Systems

- Davis Hill Developments filed for interconnection approval to United Illuminating for expansion of renewable energy generating capacity of existing solar system at Derby Transfer Station
- Green Derby LLC submitted its bid in September to United Illuminating to add 4MW of battery energy storage systems to the existing solar installation on the Derby transfer station.

Both projects, if approved by UI, would be at no cost to the city and contribute around \$130,000 per year from renewable energy generated on the city Transfer Station... for 20 years. (\$2.6 million)

Exploratory Projects

- Economic Development was invited to CT Manufacturers Innovation Forum, and, as a result, we were encouraged to explore organizing a Regional Manufacturers Showcase. We are in discussion with Derby School Superintendent to feature the programs offered at the Derby Advanced Manufacturing Technology Center.
- We have submitted CIF-7 grant for \$250,000 for Infrastructure Planning for Fountain Lake Industrial Park and awaiting outcome.
- 155 New Haven Avenue has been sold to an expanding local HVAC Contractor; further tenants are envisaged
- We are assisting the Planning Engineers representing Chase Bank to repurpose the former Starbucks property at 552 New Haven Avenue with drive through modifications with planned occupancy in Spring 2026.

- Derby Police investigated several recent purse thefts at the Big Y Plaza, 656 New Haven Avenue, where suspects targeted shoppers loading groceries into their vehicles. The investigation resulted in the arrests of a 12-year-old and a 13-year-old from New Haven.

For September 2025

The Derby Public Library is open to the public 52 hours a week, (including 5 hours on Saturdays, during the school year). The collection consists of over 63,131 items including books, DVDs, CDs, audiobooks, magazines, newspapers, and online databases. Outside books and A/V drops are open 24/7 for people to return their items. There are 2 full-time staff members and a part-time library staff of 9, as well as 2 part-time custodians. The Derby Public Library is a member of the Bibliomation Consortium which connects us to over 68 other libraries in the state of Connecticut.

The Summer Reading Program kicked off on Saturday, June 21st which also this year coincided with the birthday celebration of Harcourt Wood. The summer reading program ended with a separate celebratory ice cream party for children and adults at the end of August. Here are some summer reading program numbers from Derby Public Library:

49 programs offered for ages 0-11 8 programs offered for ages 12-18 59 programs offered for ages 19+ Total program attendance was 736!

Regular library programs continued after an eventful summer reading program: Baby Steps every other Monday, Play Dough Play every other Friday, along with the popular Play Learn Create on alternating Friday mornings, and the reintroduction of Busy Bee Bags for our youngest pre-readers.

Young adults are encouraged to join Teen Librarian for Teen Game Time on the 1st and 2nd Wednesday of the month after school, and stop in on the last Wednesday of the month for the Teen Advisory Board meeting.

The Tuesday movie matinees return to the regular 2nd and 4th Tuesday of the month schedule. There has been an uptick in resume writing appointments as well as increase in the tech time classes with Derby and valley residents. The Silver Sluggers with Rich Marazzi continue to entertain and inform baseball fans both young and old, and now meet upstairs in the meeting room. During the months of July and august he Sluggers met on the main floor in the Cohen Lobby due to the heat ad lack of AC in the meeting room and entire upper level. Also of note, Mr. Marazzi had two guest speakers this past month: Mr. George Grande and Mr. Dan Gooley. And let's not forget the very popular luncheon book discussion club led by Circulation Manager, Kathy Wilson. A virtual author visit with Bailey Seybolt was held the last Thursday of the

month. She discussed her first published book: Coram House, and shared some insights on her next project.

Peter and Barbara Rzasa kicked off our September library program event for the month of September with a historical presentation on the "Old Woodbury Path". Patrons learned about the path and how Derby played an important role in this ancient highway. Original sections can still be found and explored. This presentation was a part of Derby's 350th celebration. The following week patrons enjoyed the history of cocktails and mocktails, and learned tips for balancing flavors, and sampled herbal-inspired mocktails by presenter Rachel Koladis.

In September, the Director met with Diana Caty and Neal Delaurentis of Traveling Toys on September 22 to discuss setting up a toy library at Derby Public Library. Marianne took a field trip to the Ansonia Public Library's Children's Room to observe their toy library and explore how a similar initiative could be implemented at Derby Public Library's Children's Department.

In library maintenance news: Eli Electric replaced all the emergency exit lights, and two flood lights in August, Gary Franco Plumbing was called for a service call and to replace the handle of public toilet, Controlled Air was called out twice in summer because of extensive heat and no AC on upper level and no cool air on main floor, Bibliomation installed new software on Envisionware, September 2nd Calvert Safe and Lock quoted the library for two key system upgrade projects, on September 3rd Johnson Controls inspected the sprinkler system. Yale Pest was called out to inspect for mice on the upper level and a month later in September for both a mud wasp nest outside the original front door, and again the following week for a ground nest on the front lawn.

Staff news: In mid-September, Children's Librarian Susan Sherman retired after 20 years of dedicated service to the Derby Public Library. Sue's commitment and creativity greatly enriched the Children's Department and inspired countless young readers and families over the years. In recognition of her contributions, the Library Board and staff, gathered to celebrate her career and rededicated the picture book area as "Miss Sue's Corner" in her honor.

- Crew assigned to removed bulk violations as needed for 62 Seymour Avenue (Oterrio & Yvette Brown) and 135-141 Main Street (Polish White Eagle Corp).
- Crews worked with WPCA to clean out multiple obstructions to the catch basins on Derby Milford Road
- Crews assigned for street repairs at 72 Chapel Street, this was due to a large sink hole that was created over time near Curved Glass Distributors.

September 2025 Report to City of Derby:

Total calls EMS for the Month of April are attached and broken down by unit ID. FD 10 and FD 9 Ambulances calls. 212 in Derby, t18 mutual aid to other cities and 26 into Derby from other agencies when we were busy with other calls, and we were down an ambulance for repairs Rescue 18 went out on 48 calls. Repairs needed to be made to Rescue 18 totaling \$10,291.20 in the last 2 months to correct issues found during its annual DOT inspection, that vehicle is now 31 years old. We also had one call for Hazardous Materials.

CPR/First Aid/AED training was given to various agencies, and a defibrillator was obtained to replace an old one in Derby City Hall and a battery replacement was obtained for the Recreation Dept.

The fall Yale Regattas have are beginning, and we will utilize our boat throughout the fall to assist.

We have begun football coverage for DHS varsity, Junior Varsity, Pop Warner and Valle Generals.

Rescue 18 underwent repairs, as has our second ambulance.

Plans for the annual Storm Engine Co ball are progressing and we are helping the fire company. We are also working with the various city agencies on the upcoming referendum.

We are working to set up a regional mass casualty exercise for the City of Derby to assess the readiness of our emergency services and mutual aid partners.

Board of Alderman Report October 2025 Water Pollution Control Authority

Plant – The plant is operating within permit limits.

Plant Upgrade – In 2014 the city passed a \$31.42 million dollar referendum to replace three of the City's pump stations and begin plant upgrades. As of November 2022, approximately \$15 million dollars have been used to replace the three pump stations and sewer main replacement in the RT-34 project. With approximately \$16.4 million dollars remaining the focus has turned on a full facilities upgrade (under DEEP order) with a cost estimated at \$60 million dollars.

Collections System – Operating without issues. We Jet cleaned 4,900ft of city sewer main. Third quarter sewer cleaning maintenance complete.

Pump Station – All four pump stations are operating without issue.
